## IN THE COMMUNITY

Everyday, Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs make our cities and towns better places to grow up and live in by tackling issues that are at the heart of every community. Our programs offer solutions to **poverty, child obesity, school failure and drop-out, community safety and crime, bullying** and more - all issues that impact the well-being of Okanagan children, youth and families.

**75%** of Canadian parents are **at work** between the hours of **3-6 pm**, the hours when more than **40% of violent crimes against children occur.**

**26%** of Canadians **ages 2-17** are considered **overweight or obese.**

**90%** of children do not meet Canada's daily physical activity guideline of **60 minutes per day.**

**69%** of Boys & Girls Clubs Alumni said the Club really **'saved their life'.**  
**95%** agreed the Club gave them **valuable life skills** and helped **73% avoid trouble** with the law.

**60%** of children eat **less than** the recommended **5 servings** of fruit & vegetables per day.



Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs are **community hubs**, open after school, and in the evenings, on weekends and during the summer and actively involved in community events and activities. Clubs provide opportunities for **engagement in healthy, constructive activities** whenever children and youth are unsupervised and looking for a **safe, fun place** to go to meet new friends, get support from adult mentors and gain new experiences.

## 2010 SELECTED HIGHLIGHTS, GRANTS & NEW PROGRAMS



### FUNTASTIC GRANT HELPS VERNON KIDS AIM HIGH

A grant from the Funtastic Sports Society provided funding for the Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs to start a no-cost archery program for children and youth ages 8 to 16. The program operated at the Okanagan Boys and Girls Clubs in Vernon one day a week and was also offered in partnership with two Vernon elementary schools and at Camp ArrowFlight, making the program accessible to over 300 participants. The activity has allowed children of all abilities to participate, thus increasing their self esteem and enhancing new relationships through friendships developed in the programs both with peers and Boys & Girls Clubs staff.



### PENTICTON YOUTH BENEFIT FROM HEALTHY ACTIVE KIDS GRANTS

Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs were thrilled to receive funding from the Loblaw Companies and Wonder + Cares to support their new Generation Active program ("Gen A" for short). This program provides healthy activities and snacks for middle school aged youth who traditionally don't access recreation opportunities or are considered "at-risk". The program is offered three days a week at the three middle schools in Penticton after school throughout the school year. The objective of the program is to support youth in making healthy, active and safe choices in the hours after school by giving them free and easy access to recreation activities and the support and supervision of positive adult role models. Favorite out trips include pool at Cue Connections, wallyball at Penticton Racquet and Fitness Club, and bowling at Sun Country Bowl. Funding for this program was also made possible by JCI Penticton.



### GAP GRANT HELPS LAUNCH YOUNG CAREERS

Thanks to funding from GAP Inc. and Boys & Girls Clubs of Canada, eleven young people in West Kelowna and Peachland have some new skills to help them get their first jobs. The Westside Youth Centre received a grant to offer the GAP Career Launch program, a career exploration and mentoring program for youth in grades 7-9. The 5 week program ran twice a week and provided free training (Food Safe & World Host), snacks on Tuesdays and dinner on Thursdays. It also included guest speakers from the local GAP store and West Kelowna Superstore who gave the youth advice on what they look for when hiring staff. Both staff and youth gained a lot from the programs, with youth reporting feeling much more prepared to enter the work force as a result.



### POWER UP! GRANT GIVES KELOWNA KIDS ACADEMIC BOOST

Education is vital to every child's future and a thirst for learning means a lifetime of possibilities and personal growth. Through the support of Fidelity Investments Canada and Boys & Girls Clubs of Canada, we were awarded a Power Up! program grant. This academic enhancement program helps children and youth develop academic skills and positive attitudes about learning and school. Power Up! offers the tools, environment and tutorial support for Club members to plan, set and meet their academic goals. The grant allowed us to enhance the Power Up program at our Martin Club and expand the program to our Cedar Creek and Rutland Elementary School locations. The program was very successful with great feedback from parents and kids. Parents are eager for the program to continue in the fall and reported seeing improvements in their children's attitudes and performance in school.

## CAMP ARROWFLIGHT'S FIRST YEAR

In April 2010 we purchased and took possession of a residential camp outside of Armstrong, BC. Formerly known as the Circle Square Ranch, the camp has been in operation for over 20 years. Now called "Camp ArrowFlight" it is the center of our camping and outdoor programs for children, youth and families throughout the Okanagan. During our first summer, more than 200 campers learned about the environment, the importance of being part of a team and about themselves through programming based on recreation, adventure and active learning. 1 in 3 campers received financial assistance through our "campership" program to attend camp. Programs operate year-round and include extended camps for children, youth and families with activities such as swimming, rock climbing, bmx biking, archery, mountain boarding, canoeing and seasonal recreation. Camp ArrowFlight is also available for rentals and retreat bookings for private and community groups.



## SPECIALIZED FOSTER CARE PROGRAM

At the end of 2010 the Okanagan Boys and Girls Clubs in Penticton launched a Specialized Foster Care Program funded by the Ministry of Children and Family Development. The goal of the program is to provide children and youth in the South Okanagan with foster families and support workers to lead them in the right direction and give them a sense of belonging. The program offers support for youth between the ages of 6 to 18 years who are at-risk and/or have complex issues. The program is unique due to the extensive (24/7) support parents and youth involved in the program receive. Foster Parents are offered unlimited support from a team of two youth workers, a family specialist, and a program coordinator. They are also offered training and workshops. Youth workers help youth gain valuable life skills while promoting an environment where the child feels cared for – giving them a sense of belonging and attachment. The program will create five foster homes for children/youth in the Penticton area and are actively recruiting interested applicants.



## NEW PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN IN PEACHLAND

In September 2010 the Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs expanded our services in Peachland to include pre-school and afterschool programs. Both programs are operated by the Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs at Peachland Elementary through partnerships with School District 23 and the District of Peachland. Since 2009 we have been operating a mobile youth program at various locations in Peachland until the construction of the permanent Youth Centre is complete. This is the first time we are offering services for younger children and we are excited to be able to fulfill our mandate to help young people grow healthy, happy and safely from birth to adulthood in Peachland.



## MOONLIGHT MOVIES VISIT PARKS VALLEY-WIDE

July 11-19, as the sun went down, Interior Savings Credit Union and the Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs lit up parks from Osoyoos to Vernon with a giant, three-story high, inflatable movie screen. Similar to the classic drive-in experience, just without the cars or the concrete, communities were invited to bring their lawn chairs and blankets and enjoy a movie under the stars. Entrance to the event was by donation to the local Okanagan Boys & Girls Clubs. This was the third year the Moonlight Movies were held in Kelowna but the first year the tour was expanded to other locations in the Okanagan. As part of a commitment to building healthy communities, Interior Savings' Moonlight Movie Tour touched down in 14 interior BC communities.
